William C. ("Bill") Putney '51, one of the original founders of our chapter in 1948, has passed away. He served in the U.S. Air Force during the Korean War. Bill and Bob Tamkin owned Personality Travel & Tours in West Hollywood, which they operated for over 30 years. Their clients included the "Who's Who" of Hollywood's celebrities. They enjoyed traveling the world and meeting interesting people along the way. After retiring, they made their home in Monarch Beach (Dana Point). One of Bill's most rewarding experiences in retirement was volunteering for Laguna Shanti in Laguna Beach.

Douglas Drewry '98 passed away recently as well. At USC, he was a member of the basketball and volleyball teams. Doug was well-traveled, and built a successful career as a strategic account executive at several Fortune 500 companies including Oracle,



Garry Paskwietz '88 passed away in January 2019. Garry was our alumni spotlight member for the winter 2012 newsletter. A 1988 graduate of USC with a degree in sports information, Garry worked in sports marketing for the Los Angeles Lakers and Miller Brewing Company. 

He loved pick-up basketball, live music, mornings at the gym, and was always in search of the perfect cup of coffee. A larger-than-life personality known for his wit and dry sense of humor, Doug was always deeply involved in family and community activities. Doug built a life that was all about people.

We are also saddened to learn about the passing of Tim Conway, a Phi Delt from

Bowling Green University and famous comedian. Among Conway's notable skills was the ability to get his "Carol Burnett" co-stars to break character, unable to resist laughing at his funny accents and unwavering

straight face. Conway also played Ensign Charles Parker on "McHale's Navy," and portrayed the character Dorf in a series of short films.

This summer we will complete the third (and final) phase of our room renovation project. The renovation of rooms 1-4 and the Resident Advisor room will conclude the refurbishment of all rooms in the house which has been occurring over the past three years.
